MEMORANDUM OF ASSOCIATION
OF
PUBLIC COMPANY LIMITED BY SHARES

I. The name of the Company is Tandhan Industries Limited⁵.

II. The Registered Office of the Company will be situated in the State of the West Bengal⁶.

III. The objects for which the Company is established are follows:

(A) THE MAIN OBJECTS OF THE COMPANY TO BE PURSUED ON ITS INCORPORATION ARE,²

I: To carry on the business in India or elsewhere as manufacturers, buyers, sellers, dealers, importers, exporters, contractors, factors, agents and suppliers of profile plastic, polyethylene, tarpaulins, moulded industrial articles, industrial components and articles, traps, tarpaulin roles or their allied and auxiliary plastic products, extrusion process, and also making of polythene tarpaulin, canvas tarpaulin, Polyvinyl chloride ("vinyl") tarpaulins and sinlyon, different sizes and types of materials handling a laminate of woven and sheet materials, PVC tarpaulin sheets, PVC tarpaulin rolls, woven polyester fabric, waterproofing, low density polyethylene and high density polyethylene, PVC tarpaulin sheets, PVC tarpaulin roll, manufacturing and trading of cross laminated sheets and other plastic products.

(B) OBJECTS INCIDENTAL OR ANCILLARY TO THE ATTAINMENT OF MAIN OBJECTS

1. To draw, make, accept, hold, endorse, discount, execute, issue, and otherwise deal in negotiable promissory notes, drafts, hundies, bills of exchange, bills of lading, warrants, debentures, securities, and other negotiable or transferable instruments and securities.
2. To enter into partnership or arrangement for sharing profits or joint ventures with any person, persons, or company carrying on or about to carry on any business capable of being conducted so as directly or indirectly to benefit this Company, and to acquire or join in acquiring any such business as covered by the Object Clause (A) above.
3. To sell, improve, manage, develop, exchange, lease, mortgage, dispose of, turn to account, or otherwise deal with all or any part of the undertaking, property, investments, and rights of the Company.
4. To apply for, purchase, or otherwise acquire any patent, trademark, license, concession, protection, right, or privilege conferring exclusive, non-exclusive, or limited rights to any invention which may seem capable of being used for any of the purposes of the Company, or the acquisition of which may seem directly or indirectly beneficial or advantageous to the Company; and to use, exercise, develop, or grant licenses or privileges in that respect, and to assist or spend money in making experiments, tests, or improvements of any invention, patent, or right which the Company may acquire or propose to acquire.
5. To carry on investment business and to purchase, acquire, hold, and dispose of, or otherwise deal in and invest in fixed deposits, shares, stocks, debentures, bonds, obligations, and securities issued or guaranteed by any company or by any government, state, dominion, municipality, local authority, or public body, whether in India or elsewhere; and to deal in real estate or property either out of its own funds or out of borrowed funds, and to vary, exchange, or otherwise dispose of such investments or properties.
6. To distribute among the members of the Company dividends, including bonus shares (including fractional share certificates), out of profits, accumulated profits, or funds and resources of the Company, in any manner permissible under law in the event of winding up.
7. To allot shares in this Company to be considered as fully or partly paid-up in payment or consideration for any service, property, or asset acquired by the Company.
8. To purchase or acquire or to undertake any business or part of a business, property, rights, or liabilities of any other corporation, firm, or person carrying on a similar business or any business which the Company can carry on under this Memorandum, and to amalgamate or merge with any company having objects

similar to those of this Company, or to undergo any process of reconstruction as permitted under the provisions of the Companies Act, 2013.

9. To open branches in India and elsewhere and to get the Company registered in any foreign country, and to adopt such means of making known to the public the business or products of the Company as may seem expedient, particularly by advertising in the press, issuing circulars, or publishing books and periodicals.
10. To pay out of the funds of the Company all costs, charges, and expenses preliminary and incidental to the promotion, formation, establishment, and registration of the Company.
11. To provide for the welfare of employees or ex-employees (including directors and ex-directors) of the Company and their families or dependents by building or contributing to the building of dwelling houses or quarters; to grant monthly pensions, gratuities, allowances, bonuses, profit-sharing benefits, or other payments; to create and maintain provident funds, gratuity funds, or other employee welfare schemes; and to provide hospitals, dispensaries, recreation, or educational facilities for employees.
12. To guarantee the payment of money, whether secured or unsecured, payable under or in respect of bonds, debentures, contracts, mortgages, charges, obligations, or other securities of any company or authority, central, state, municipal, local, or otherwise, or of any person, whether incorporated or not, and generally to transact all kinds of guarantee business.
13. To promote, form, or acquire any company, and to take, purchase, or acquire shares or interests in any company, and to transfer to such company any property of this Company, and to invest in or otherwise deal in shares, debentures, and other securities of such companies, either from its own funds or from borrowed funds, and to subsidize or otherwise assist any such company.
14. To carry on the business of manufacturers, dealers, importers, exporters, or commission agents of iron founders, mechanical engineers, agricultural implements, tools, machinery, metal works, boiler makers, machinists, and iron and steel converters.
15. To carry on business as producers, manufacturers, processors, refiners, stockists, dealers, importers, exporters, traders, or agents of industrial, chemical, and gaseous products such as oxygen, acetylene, ammonia, carbon dioxide, nitrogen, hydrogen, helium, and other gases used in industries, hospitals, aviation, agriculture, or domestic purposes, and to manufacture or deal in machinery, plants, and accessories related thereto.
16. To carry on the business of printers, publishers, stationers, lithographers, designers, and paper product manufacturers, and to deal in books, stationery, envelopes, visiting cards, calendars, and other printed materials.
17. To produce, manufacture, process, import, export, sell, and generally deal in lime, limestone, cement pipes, sheets, bricks, refractories, and other building materials.
18. To manufacture, process, import, export, buy, sell, and deal in vegetable oils, vanaspati, soaps, lubricants, and products derived from seeds, agricultural, or forest produce.
19. To carry on business as timber merchants, sawmill proprietors, and timber growers, and to import, export, and deal in timber, plywood, firewood, and other wood-based products.
20. To manufacture, process, buy, sell, or deal in construction materials such as bricks, marble, tiles, sanitaryware, pipes, cement, paints, hardware, glass, electrical goods, and building materials made of cement, stone, wood, fiber, paper, glass, rubber, or plastic.
21. To carry on business as manufacturers and dealers in machinery, tools, motors, electrical equipment, transformers, switches, cables, fans, refrigerators, televisions, and other electrical or electronic appliances and parts.
22. To carry on business as manufacturers and dealers in rubber, plastic, PVC, resins, and other synthetic materials, and products derived therefrom.

23. To carry on business as manufacturers, importers, exporters, and dealers in food products, beverages, confectionery, dairy products, fertilizers, medicines, footwear, stationery, chemicals, and other commodities.
24. To manufacture, import, export, and deal in bulbs, lamps, tubes, fittings, and lighting equipment.
25. To manufacture, buy, sell, and deal in packaging materials, containers, cans, drums, bottles, utensils, cutlery, and related products made from metal, glass, fiber, paper, wood, or synthetic compounds.
26. To establish, maintain, and operate shipping, air, or road transport services and ancillary facilities, including acquisition and operation of vessels, vehicles, or equipment.
27. To carry on business as manufacturers, refiners, converters, traders, and dealers in calcium carbonate, lime, and allied chemical products.
28. To carry on business as producers, importers, exporters, and dealers in coal, coke, ores, minerals, metals, precious and semi-precious stones, and related articles.
29. To manufacture, import, export, buy, sell, and deal in batteries, battery containers, and allied electrical products.
30. To carry on business as manufacturers, importers, and dealers in sugar and allied products, confectionery, and sweetening agents.
31. To acquire, lease, or develop estates, farms, plantations, or agricultural lands and carry on cultivation, production, and trade of agricultural and horticultural products.
32. To carry on business as manufacturers, importers, and dealers in paper, packaging materials, stationery, and related products.
33. To carry on business as manufacturers, dealers, and traders in iron, steel, and foundry equipment, materials, and tools.
34. To engage in business and consultancy relating to engineering, construction, pollution control, and environmental protection, and to provide technical or industrial know-how and services.
35. To carry on research, development, and consulting work relating to industry, agriculture, management, accounting, or technology, and to publish, distribute, or circulate technical or commercial information.
36. To acquire, develop, or operate land, buildings, and real estate; to construct, improve, or lease commercial or residential properties, hotels, markets, factories, and offices.
37. To manage land, buildings, and properties, collect rents, and provide utilities or facilities for tenants and occupiers.
38. To carry on business as manufacturers or dealers in ice, beverages, dairy products, processed foods, and to establish cold storage and warehousing facilities.
39. To carry on business as agents, traders, importers, and dealers in machinery, equipment, engineering goods, and spare parts.
40. To carry on business as hoteliers, restaurateurs, caterers, and dealers in provisions, beverages, and refreshments.
41. To carry on business of operating hospitals, nursing homes, clinics, laboratories, and health or medical facilities.
42. To carry on business as travel, tour, and booking agents, and to arrange transport, accommodation, and related services for travelers and tourists.

IV. The liability of the member(s) is limited and this liability is limited to the amount unpaid, if any, on the shares held by them.³

V. The Authorized Share Capital of the Company is Rs. 60,00,00,000/- (Rupees Sixty Crore) divided into 6,00,00,000 (Six Crore) equity shares of Rs. 10/- (Rupees Ten only) each, with the rights and privileges and conditions attaching thereto as provided by the requirements of the Company for the time being with power to increase and reduce the capital of the Company and to divide the shares in the capital for the time being into several classes and to attach thereto respectively such preferential rights, privileges or conditions as may be determined by or in accordance with the regulations of the Company and to vary, modify or abrogate any such rights, privileges or conditions in such manner as may for the time being be provided by the regulations of the Company.⁴

4. The Shareholders of the Company at the Annual General Meeting for the financial year 2024-2025 held on Wednesday, 24th September 2025 at 12:00 P.M. (IST) through Video Conferencing / Other Audio-Visual Means (VC/OAVM), vide Special Resolution, approved the increase in authorised share capital.
5. The Shareholders of the Company through postal ballot and e-voting on Thursday, 12th February, 2026, pursuant to section 108 and section 110 of the Companies Act, 2013, read with rules 20 and 22 of the companies (management and administration) rules, 2014 approved the change in name of the company from Sarmitra Commercial Limited to Twelfth Industries Limited;
6. The Shareholders of the Company through postal ballot and e-voting on Thursday, 12th February, 2026, pursuant to section 108 and section 110 of the Companies Act, 2013, read with rules 20 and 22 of the companies (management and administration) rules, 2014 approved the shifting of registered office from the state of Maharashtra to the state of West Bengal.

ARTICLES OF ASSOCIATION
OF
TANDHAN INDUSTRIES LIMITED¹

The regulations contained in Table 'F' of the First Schedule to the Companies Act, 2013 shall not apply to the Company, except in so far as they are embodied in the following Articles, which shall be regulations for the management of the Company.

Article Number	Description
I	Interpretation
1	In these regulations the Act means the Companies Act 2013 the seal means the common seal of the company. Unless the context otherwise requires words or expressions contained in these regulations shall bear the same meaning as in the Act or any statutory modification thereof in force at the date at which these regulations become binding on the company
II	Share Capital and Variation of rights
1	Subject to the provisions of the Act and these Articles the shares in the capital of the company shall be under the control of the Directors who may issue allot or otherwise dispose of the same or any of them to such persons in such proportion and on such terms and conditions and either at a premium or at par and at such time as they may from time to time think fit.
2	Every person whose name is entered as a member in the register of members shall be entitled to receive within two months after incorporation in case of subscribers to the memorandum or after allotment or within one month after the application for the registration of transfer or transmission or within such other period as the conditions of issue shall be provided one certificate for all his shares without payment of any charges or several certificates each for one or more of his shares upon payment of twenty rupees for each certificate after the first. Every certificate shall be under the seal and shall specify the shares to which it relates and the amount paid - up thereon. In respect of any share or shares held jointly by several persons the company shall not be bound to issue more than one certificate and delivery of a certificate for a share to one of several joint holders shall be sufficient delivery to all such holders.
3	If any share certificate be worn out defaced mutilated or torn or if there be no further space on the back for endorsement of transfer then upon production and surrender thereof to the company a new certificate may be issued in lieu thereof and if any certificate is lost or destroyed then upon proof thereof to the satisfaction of the company and on execution of such indemnity as the company deem adequate a new certificate in lieu thereof shall be given. Every certificate under this Article shall be issued on payment of twenty rupees for each certificate. The provisions of Articles(2) and(3) shall mutatis mutandis apply to debentures of the company.
4	Except as required by law no person shall be recognised by the company as holding any share upon any trust and the company shall not be bound by or be compelled in any way to recognise (even when having notice thereof) any equitable contingent future or partial interest in any share or any interest in any fractional part of a share or (except only as by these regulations or by law otherwise provided) any other rights in respect of any share except an absolute right to the entirety thereof in the registered holder.
5	The company may exercise the powers of paying commissions conferred by sub-section (6) of section 40 provided that the rate per cent or the amount of the commission paid or agreed to be paid shall be disclosed in the manner required by that section and rules made thereunder. The rate or amount of the commission shall not exceed the rate or amount

	prescribed in rules made under sub- section (6) of section 40. The commission may be satisfied by the payment of cash or the allotment of fully or partly paid shares or partly in the one way and partly in the other.
6	If at any time the share capital is divided into different classes of shares the rights attached to any class (unless otherwise provided by the terms of issue of the shares of that class) may subject to the provisions of section 48 and whether or not the company is being wound up be varied with the consent in writing of the holders of three-fourths of the issued shares of that class or with the sanction of a special resolution passed at a separate meeting of the holders of the shares of that class. To every such separate meeting the provisions of these regulations relating to general meetings shall mutatis mutandis apply but so that the necessary quorum shall be at least two persons holding at least one-third of the issued shares of the class in question.
7	The rights conferred upon the holders of the shares of any class issued with preferred or other rights shall not unless otherwise expressly provided by the terms of issue of the shares of that class be deemed to be varied by the creation or issue of further shares ranking pari passu therewith
8	Subject to the provisions of section 55 any preference shares may with the sanction of an ordinary resolution be issued on the terms that they are to be redeemed on such terms and in such manner as the company before the issue of the shares may by special.
9	The company shall have a first and paramount lien on every share (not being a fully paid share) for all monies (whether presently payable or not) called or payable at a fixed time in respect of that share and on all shares (not being fully paid shares) standing registered in the name of a single person for all monies presently payable by him or his estate to the company Provided that the Board of directors may at any time declare any share to be wholly or in part exempt from the provisions of this clause. The company's lien if any on a share shall extend to all dividends payable and bonuses declared from time to time in respect of such shares.
10	The company may sell in such manner as the Board thinks fit any shares on which the company has a lien Provided that no sale shall be made unless a sum in respect of which the lien exists is presently payable or b until the expiration of fourteen days after a notice in writing stating and demanding payment of such part of the amount in respect of which the lien exists as is presently payable has been given to the registered holder for the time being of the share or the person entitled thereto by reason of his death or insolvency.
11	To give effect to any such sale the Board may authorise some person to transfer the shares sold to the purchaser thereof The purchaser shall be registered as the holder of the shares comprised in any such transfer. The purchaser shall not be bound to see to the application of the purchase money nor shall his title to the shares be affected by any irregularity or invalidity in the proceedings in reference to the sale.
12	The proceeds of the sale shall be received by the company and applied in payment of such part of the amount in respect of which the lien exists as is presently payable. The residue if any shall subject to a like lien for sums not presently payable as existed upon the shares before the sale be paid to the person entitled to the shares at the date of the sale.
	Calls on shares
13	The Board may from time to time make calls upon the members in respect of any monies unpaid on their shares (whether on account of the nominal value of the shares or by way of premium) and not by the conditions of allotment thereof made payable at fixed times Provided that no call shall exceed one-fourth of the nominal value of the share or be payable at less than one month from the date fixed for the payment of the last preceding call. Each member shall subject to receiving at least fourteen days notice specifying the time or times and place of payment pay to the company at the time or times and place so specified the amount called on his shares. A call may be revoked or postponed at the discretion of the Board.
14	A call shall be deemed to have been made at the time when the resolution of the Board authorizing the call was passed and may be required to be paid by instalments.
15	The joint holders of a share shall be jointly and severally liable to pay all calls in respect

	thereof.
16	If a sum called in respect of a share is not paid before or on the day appointed for payment thereof the person from whom the sum is due shall pay interest thereon from the day appointed for payment thereof to the time of actual payment at ten per cent per annum or at such lower rate if any as the Board may determine. The Board shall be at liberty to waive payment of any such interest wholly or in part.
17	Any sum which by the terms of issue of a share becomes payable on allotment or at any fixed date whether on account of the nominal value of the share or by way of premium shall for the purposes of these regulations be deemed to be a call duly made and payable on the date on which by the terms of issue such sum becomes payable. In case of non-payment of such sum all the relevant provisions of these regulations as to payment of interest and expenses forfeiture or otherwise shall apply as if such sum had become payable by virtue of a call duly made and notified.
18	The Board - a. may if it thinks fit receive from any member willing to advance the same all or any part of the monies uncalled and unpaid upon any shares held by him and b. upon all or any of the monies so advanced may (until the same would but for such advance become presently payable) pay interest at such rate not exceeding unless the company in general meeting shall otherwise direct twelve per cent per annum as may be agreed upon between the Board and the member paying the sum in advance.
	Transfer of shares
19	The instrument of transfer of any share in the company shall be executed by or on behalf of both the transferor and transferee. The transferor shall be deemed to remain a holder of the share until the name of the transferee is entered in the register of members in respect thereof.
20	The Board may subject to the right of appeal conferred by section 58 decline to register the transfer of a share not being a fully paid share to a person of whom they do not approve or any transfer of shares on which the company has a lien.
21	The Board may decline to recognise any instrument of transfer unless a. the instrument of transfer is in the form as prescribed in rules made under sub-section (1) of section 56b. the instrument of transfer is accompanied by the certificate of the shares to which it relates and such other evidence as the Board may reasonably require to show the right of the transferor to make the transfer and c. the instrument of transfer is in respect of only one class of shares.
22	On giving not less than seven days previous notice in accordance with section 91 and rules made thereunder the registration of transfers may be suspended at such times and for such periods as the Board may from time to time determine Provided that such registration shall not be suspended for more than thirty days at any one time or for more than forty-five days in the aggregate in any year.
	Transmission of shares
23	On the death of a member the survivor or survivors where the member was a joint holder and his nominee or nominees or legal representatives where he was a sole holder shall be the only persons recognised by the company as having any title to his interest in the shares Nothing in clause (i) shall release the estate of a deceased joint holder from any liability in respect of any share which had been jointly held by him with other persons.
24	Any person becoming entitled to a share in consequence of the death or insolvency of a member may upon such evidence being produced as may from time to time properly be required by the Board and subject as hereinafter provided elect either to be registered himself as holder of the share or to make such transfer of the share as the deceased or insolvent member could have made. The Board shall in either case have the same right to decline or suspend registration as it would have had if the deceased or insolvent member had transferred the share before his death or insolvency.
25	If the person so becoming entitled shall elect to be registered as holder of the share himself he shall deliver or send to the company a notice in writing signed by him stating that he so elects. If the person aforesaid shall elect to transfer the share he shall testify his election by executing a transfer of the share. All the limitations restrictions and provisions of these

	regulations relating to the right to transfer and the registration of transfers of shares shall be applicable to any such notice or transfer as aforesaid as if the death or insolvency of the member had not occurred and the notice or transfer were a transfer signed by that member.
26	A person becoming entitled to a share by reason of the death or insolvency of the holder shall be entitled to the same dividends and other advantages to which he would be entitled if he were the registered holder of the share except that he shall not before being registered as a member in respect of the share be entitled in respect of it to exercise any right conferred by membership in relation to meetings of the company Provided that the Board may at any time give notice requiring any such person to elect either to be registered himself or to transfer the share and if the notice is not complied with within ninety days the Board may thereafter withhold payment of all dividends bonuses or other monies payable in respect of the share until the requirements of the notice have been complied with.
27	In case of a One Person Company on the death of the sole member the person nominated by such member shall be the person recognised by the company as having title to all the shares of the member the nominee on becoming entitled to such shares in case of the members death shall be informed of such event by the Board of the company such nominee shall be entitled to the same dividends and other rights and liabilities to which such sole member of the company was entitled or liable on becoming member such nominee shall nominate any other person with the prior written consent of such person who shall in the event of the death of the member become the member of the company.
	Forfeiture of shares
28	If a member fails to pay any call or instalment of a call on the day appointed for payment thereof the Board may at any time thereafter during such time as any part of the call or instalment remains unpaid serve a notice on him requiring payment of so much of the call or instalment as is unpaid together with any interest which may have accrued.
29	The notice aforesaid shall name a further day (not being earlier than the expiry of fourteen days from the date of service of the notice) on or before which the payment required by the notice is to be made and state that in the event of non-payment on or before the day so named the shares in respect of which the call was made shall be liable to be forfeited.
30	If the requirements of any such notice as aforesaid are not complied with any share in respect of which the notice has been given may at any time thereafter before the payment required by the notice has been made be forfeited by a resolution of the Board to that effect.
31	A forfeited share may be sold or otherwise disposed of on such terms and in such manner as the Board thinks fit. At any time before a sale or disposal as aforesaid the Board may cancel the forfeiture on such terms as it thinks fit.
32	A person whose shares have been forfeited shall cease to be a member in respect of the forfeited shares but shall notwithstanding the forfeiture remain liable to pay to the company all monies which at the date of forfeiture were presently payable by him to the company in respect of the shares. The liability of such person shall cease if and when the company shall have received payment in full of all such monies in respect of the shares.
33	A duly verified declaration in writing that the declarant is a director the manager or the secretary of the company and that a share in the company has been duly forfeited on a date stated in the declaration shall be conclusive evidence of the facts therein stated as against all persons claiming to be entitled to the share The company may receive the consideration if any given for the share on any sale or disposal thereof and may execute a transfer of the share in favour of the person to whom the share is sold or disposed of The transferee shall thereupon be registered as the holder of the share and The transferee shall not be bound to see to the application of the purchase money if any nor shall his title to the share be affected by any irregularity or invalidity in the proceedings in reference to the forfeiture sale or disposal of the share.

39	The company in general meeting may upon the recommendation of the Board resolve that it is desirable to capitalise any part of the amount for the time being standing to the credit of any of the company's reserve accounts or to the credit of the profit and loss account or otherwise available for distribution and that such sum be accordingly set free for distribution in the manner specified in clause (ii) amongst the members who would have been entitled thereto if distributed by way of dividend and in the same proportions. 42	All general meetings other than annual general meeting shall be called extraordinary general meeting.
43	The Board may whenever it thinks fit call an extraordinary general meeting. If at any time directors capable of acting who are sufficient in number to form a quorum are not within India any director or any two members of the company may call an extraordinary general meeting in the same manner as nearly as possible as that in which such a meeting may be called by the Board.
	Proceedings at general meetings
44	No business shall be transacted at any general meeting unless a quorum of members is present at the time when the meeting proceeds to business. Save as otherwise provided herein the quorum for the general meetings shall be as provided in section 103.
45	The chairperson if any of the Board shall preside as Chairperson at every general meeting of the company.
46	If there is no such Chairperson or if he is not present within fifteen minutes after the time appointed for holding the meeting or is unwilling to act as chairperson of the meeting the directors present shall elect one of their members to be Chairperson of the meeting.

	Adjournment of meeting
49	The Chairperson may with the consent of any meeting at which a quorum is present and shall if so directed by the meeting adjourn the meeting from time to time and from place to place. 	Proxy
57	The instrument appointing a proxy and the power-of-attorney or other authority if any under which it is signed or a notarised copy of that power or authority shall be deposited at the registered office of the company not less than 48 hours before the time for holding the meeting or adjourned meeting at which the person named in the instrument proposes to vote or in the case of a poll not less than 24 hours before the time appointed for the taking of the poll and in default the instrument of proxy shall not be treated as valid.
58	An instrument appointing a proxy shall be in the form as prescribed in the rules made under section 105
59	A vote given in accordance with the terms of an instrument of proxy shall be valid notwithstanding the previous death or insanity of the principal or the revocation of the proxy or of the authority under which the proxy was executed or the transfer of the shares in respect of which the proxy is given Provided that no intimation in writing of such death insanity revocation or transfer shall have been received by the company at its office before the commencement of the meeting or adjourned meeting at which the proxy is used.
	Board of Directors
60	As the date of adoption of these Articles the following are the Directors of the Company. Present Directors 1. M. SRIRAM PRASAD 2. B. SHANKAR 3. M. SRINIVAS PRASAD
61	The remuneration of the directors shall in so far as it consists of a monthly payment be deemed to accrue from day-to-day. In addition to the remuneration payable to them in pursuance of the Act the directors may be paid all travelling hotel and other expenses properly incurred by them in attending and returning from meetings of the Board of Directors or any committee thereof or general meetings of the company or in connection with the business of the company.
62	The Board may pay all expenses incurred in getting up and registering the company
63	The company may exercise the powers conferred on it by section 88 with regard to the keeping of a foreign register and the Board may (subject to the provisions of that section) make and vary such regulations as it may think fit respecting the keeping of any such register.

79	The Board shall provide for the safe custody of the seal. 89	The Board shall from time to time determine whether and to what extent and at what times and places and under what conditions or regulations the accounts and books of the company or any of them shall be open to the inspection of members not being directors. No member (not being a director) shall have any right of inspecting any account or book or document of the company except as conferred by law or authorised by the Board or by the company in general meeting.
	Winding up
90	Subject to the provisions of Chapter XX of the Act and rules made thereunder If the company shall be wound up the liquidator may with the sanction of a special resolution of the company and any other sanction required by the Act divide amongst the members in specie or kind the whole or any part of the assets of the company whether they shall consist of property of the same kind or not. For the purpose aforesaid the liquidator may set such value as he deems fair upon any property to be divided as aforesaid and may determine how such division shall be carried out as between the members or different classes of members. The liquidator may with the like sanction vest the whole or any part of such
